Whether from window or foreshore our view across the water of Te Awanui (Tauranga Harbour) is drawn to Matakana, however nestled against that backdrop is another island - Rangiwaea.

Separated from the main coastal island by Hunters Creek yet accessible at low tide the 267 hectares comprises forestry, pastoral grazing, horticulture and agriculture operated by the Tauwhao Te Ngare Trust for the benefit of the 19 residents.

Settled well before colonisation when these islands comprised coastal forest dominated by Kauri, Rimu, Kahikatea, Totara and Pohutukawa the islands contained a vast diversity of bird and fish life. Now fresh and saltwater wetlands are being restored by hapu members of the Ngai Tauwhao marae of Ngai Te Rangi through a 25 year riparian restoration project.

Archaeological deposits indicate large complex settlements once existed here. Now most residents who have lived all their lives on the island now do so on whanau land with the hapu embarking on a comprehensive Papakainga Housing project. Island children are home schooled with one attending school on the mainland. Access is by the barge and ferry services which can make transport cost expensive.



Fishing off Kaiarero - Tilby Point

The site of the boat ramp at Fergusson Park, known over the years as Kaiarero (once affectionately referred to as The Pope's nose) has become a popular spot for local fishers seeking Kingfish (kingi). Growing up to 1.5m in length the green/ gold band from nose to yellow tail makes for a spectacular catch from either rod, fly fishing or kayak in the waters off the park.

Predominantly found in the northern half of the North Island, Kingi are a carnivorous school fish feeding off the small flounder that are stirred off the bottom by the movement of stingray that can be found in abundance in our tidal harbour. Kingi are attracted to rock outcrops or in this case the boat ramp where a change in depth occurs. Incoming tides and summer temperatures offer better chances of success.

Other popular catches are Snapper and Kahawai and bones of these two plus those of Horse Mackerel, Gurnard, Trevally and Barracouta were found by archaeologists at the Otumoetai Pa site. The lack of Kingfish bones indicates that changes to the harbour over many years have altered the fish in our local waters. Using baited hooks or trolling stone lures along in the water were the methods deployed by Maori and today our fishermen use livebait, high speed jigs, surface poppers and stickbait.





Matua Residents Assn Representing your Views

From time to time we are asked why we are not making submissions to council on a variety of specific topics affecting the city.

The answer is simple. Without a mechanism to gauge the majority point of view we do not feel we have the right to make a statement For or Against. For every resident in favour of a museum or a cycleway or road upgrade or chlorinated water there is an opposing point of view. All councils are required to act in terms of the Local Government Act 2002 and often it is this that is driving the stand Tauranga City Council takes. We recommend a quick glance at this to understand their rational.

For matters directly relating to Matua we make submissions to Council specifically asking that Tauranga City Council inform and listen to people that are affected. Direct communication, especially through one on one or public meetings, are more effective than relying on media reports.

If you feel there is a need to have an open discussion on a topic then please contact us and let's take it further.

PREDATOR FREE BAY OF PLENTY

You can help bring native birds back to our neighbourhoods by participating in Predator Free BOP. This movement will be achieved by residents chipping in to help eradicate predators such as rats and mice from the BOP.

By having a trap in your back yard we can give our native species a fighting chance, it is anticipated that one rat can take 50 native birds in it's life time. Based on the success of a similar initiative in Wellington and with the hope that this will spread throughout the country the Matua and Merivale suburbs are the pilot locations for BOP. Of course this does not restrict the practice to just these areas. The teams of volunteers, some from Matua Estuary Care group, who currently operate traps in the Estuary areas and along our foreshore, will continue their good work.

With funding from local Rotary and with the traps manufactured by volunteer labour at Menz Shed the free wooden traps can be obtained by contacting the team at www.predatorfreebop.nz Check out their facebook page.

Over 150 were given out at the recent Matua School gala day where local councils had a stand in support of this initiative. Matua Residents Assn have offered to coordinate the local distribution where the target is to place one in every five backyards.

Snippets of History

The people of Otumoetai Pa would have been surprised to see the first European ship enter the harbour when the Anglican Mission schooner Herald arrived in June 1826. It had sailed from the Bay of Islands seeking food for the mission boarding schools.

The missionaries on the Herald brought seeds and cuttings of plants which had never been grown in the Bay. Peach, guince, pumpkin and other seeds were distributed to the local growers. By the 20th century descendants of the Peach trees grown from these original plantings were common all over Tauranga, including Otumoetai Pa where they still survive.

Otumoetai Pa was within the 50,000 acres of land confiscated by the Government in 1865, following the battles of Gate Pa and Te Ranga in 1864. This spelt the end of Otumoetai as a Pa. Parts of it were granted to chiefs Taiho Ngatai and Tomika Te Mutu and half an acre went to trader James Farrow. The rest was put up for sale and by 1881 the chiefs land and Farrows section

had all been sold. The whole Pa was occupied by two European farmers - Robert Matheson and John Snodgrass.

The Value is in the Land

Anyone thinking of buying along the Otumoetai foreshore will be aware of the value of the land. This has long been the case as in pre European days Ngamarama people who from the 14th century were attracted by the ideal living area and by the 16th century six Pa sites controlled by Ngati Ranginui existed on the escarpment overlooking the beach. Kainga (undefended village) and cultivation sites were also sited across the peninsula. Defences and palisading were built over time creating a defensive Pa which was hotly contested and by the arrival of European in the 19th century the area was under the control of Ngaitarangi.

As the largest Pa in Tauranga and the residence of principal chief, Tupaea, it was known by missionaries as the capital of the



Drones in The Sky

With more instances of sighting a drone in the sky above us it is timely to point out the rules for the operators of these machines.

Pilots must ensure all practical steps are taken to minimise hazards to persons, property and other aircraft. There is to be no flying within 4 kilometres of the airport or rescue helicopter base. Flights must be in daylight and the craft must be within eye site of the pilot at all times.

When flying over homes and parks there is a requirement to obtain the authority of the property owner so before heading to our parks talk with the Council. They will point you to **www.airshare.co.nz** where you can register your flight. Always speak with air traffic control if within controlled air space.


