## Life in Otumoetai Pa

With fishing playing a large part in the food supply of Maori sourcing tools that aided the task meant using natural resources from near and far. Obsidian. a strong but sharp volcanic glass was ideal for scaling gutting and slicing fish. This could be obtained from that large island on the northern horizon, Tuhua (Mayor Island) some 35 km away. Moa bones could be shaped into single hooks and when that source disappeared other bone, coupled to a wooden shank was used.

The obsidian glass had many other uses, from preparing Flax to creating fibre for fishing lines. cloth, cloaks, matting, baskets and animal traps to

combs. needles and tattooing needles.

Obsidian was traded for greenstone (Pounamu) from the South Island. The flax was traded as a source of rope for sailing ships plying their trade around New Zealand and as far as Sydney.

## **Hot Water Pools**

Dotted throughout the suburbs are a number of swimming pools with heating from artesian hot water bores that tap in to the Tauranga geothermal area extending from Waihi Beach to Paengaroa. This is a large low-temperature geothermal system (between 30°C and 70°C) that shares the same aguifer as the cold groundwater resource. Matua has 17 bores and Otumoetai 4. Often several neighbours share the bore and chip in for the maintenance and inspections by Regional Council.

A resource consent is also needed for the taking of geothermal fluid and/or heat from a geothermal well, and for the discharge of that fluid by reinjection, or to land or water.

To help with scientific modelling work on the extent of the Tauranga Geothermal System in terms of its depth and geographic scale, geothermal bores and groundwater takes are being monitored and tested. There is potential that parts of the System are sensitive to permanent cooling if it is overused. For example if too much geothermal water is taken, then cool water may replace the warm, cooling the heat left in the rocks and potentially taking many years to regenerate.

# Matua What's in a name?

The concise Maori dictionary shows Matua as parent, adult, father, important.

It seems no doubt that the name for our suburb stems from Matua-Iwi Pa, the history of which can be found in an article on the Residents Assn website. There are two definitions of the name Matua-Iwi. One is parent Pa, all the other Pa being it's offspring. A second interpretation is Totara Pa - all the other Pa in the locality are it's branches.

Matua as a suburb only really gained it's name in the late 1960's, prior to that it was part of the greater Otumoetai region and more latterly part of Otumoetai West.

There are people who have Matua as their first or last name. It does however have a world wide reach. Closest to home is the Easter Island mythology of Hotu Matu'a, a legendary supreme chief and part of the Polynesian migration of

Much further north but still in the northwest Pacific is the uninhabited sub arctic volcanic island of Matua near the centre of the Kuril Island chain. The Treaty of St Petersberg saw the Kuril Islands transfer from the Empire of Russia to the Empire of Japan. During WW2 it was garrisoned by 7/8000 men and had an active runway but after the war it returned to Russian control and was home to a radar station. The 1500 meter main cone has lava flows on all sides and in 2009 the eruption was large enough to disrupt air traffic between Asia and North America.

In India the Matua Mahasangh

is a Hindu sect of seven million who call West Bengal home.

A large number of Matua are Bangladesh refugees as the movement was founded in the mid 1800's in the Faridpur province of Bangladesh. With many socially disadvantaged the sect preach love, tolerance, gender equality and non- distinction irrespective of caste, class or creed. The rest of the world could take note of these beliefs.

Across the other side of the world Matua is a town in the province of Pinar del Rio. Cuba.

And to finish with Matua is a genus of South Pacific ground spider with two species found only in New Zealand.

## **Otumoetai Doctors Summer Holidays are** coming..... are you ready?



Remember to 'slip, slop, slap" this summer to protect yourself from skin cancers.

A melanoma is the most dangerous type of skin cancer. It grows from special cells in the skin called melanocytes. A melanoma is usually brown or blackish in colour and looks like a freckle, mole or spot. They can begin in moles, but most being in normal skin.

#### WHO GETS MELANOMA?

About 1 in 60 people will get melanoma. It is seen most often in people aged 30-50 years, but it can occur in younger people. People at increased risk are those with:

- Several dark moles
- Freckles
- Fair white skin
- Skin that reacts to sunlight (burns easily and does not tan)

#### WHY DO THEY OCCUR?

We do not know why all of them begin, but they are much more likely to occur in people who have had a lot of exposure to the sun. Queenslanders have one of the highest rates of melanoma in the world. In spite of this, melanomas do not only occur in areas exposed to the sun - they can occur all over the body.

#### **HOW DO I KNOW IF I HAVE A MELANOMA?**

Only a few moles go on to melanomas. Any changes that occur in a mole should raise suspicion. Changes may include:

- Any change in the colour of the mole
- An increase in size, or spread to surrounding skin
- Thickening of the mole

#### Bleeding

Itching

In fact, any change in a mole may be a warning, and should be discussed with your doctor.

#### WHAT CAN BE DONE?

Once suspicion is raised about a mole, it should be removed by your doctor. It will then be sent away to be looked at under a microscope. to check if it is a melanoma. Further treatment depends on the result of this test.

#### **CAN IT BE CURED?**

If melanoma are removed early, they can be completely cured. Over 95% of patients are cured with early removal.

#### PREVENTION IS THE BEST CURE!

To decrease your chances of getting a melanoma, you should protect yourself from the sun. These rules should be followed:

- Try to avoid direct sunlight when the sun is strongest (from 10am to 2pm standard time, ie from 11am to 3pm daylight saving time)
- Always wear a broad-brimmed hat and T-shirt or preferably long sleeves in the sun
- Use SPF factor 15 or more sunscreen on exposed skin and renew it regularly
- Sunbaking might give you a good tan, but it is also going to increase your chances of getting a melanoma and so you should avoid it.

If you have any concerns about a mole, freckle or spot, please do not hesitate to ask your doctor or nurse to check it for you when you are next seeing

## The Body Is An Amazing Thing

- Given a chance and some direction -


Many injuries we see in the clinic ultimately come back to tissue being put under a load that it was not used to.

This may be a force applied faster, heavier or more frequently than that particular part of the body is used to.

An example of this is someone who walks around or up Mount Maunganui 4 times per week. They may be fit for walking and hill work, but if they started to play tennis for the first time albeit after a few months break or for the first time - and whilst jumping for the ball they injure their Achilles. In this scenario,

the Achilles had been trained to cope with walking but had not been trained or told how to cope with the load and speed required to get them into the air when playing tennis and as a consequence this area is injured.

The message is that the body is adaptive and has huge potential for the tasks it is trained for given the chance and time. However the body can be vulnerable when taking on something new, faster, heavier or more frequent than it is accustomed to.

Some simple exercises can be given to be performed at home with appropriate tasks in mind and therefore decreasing the likelihood of an injury.

## **Tauranga Airport Noise**

As a rapidly growing city Tauranga needs an effective and efficient airport. The volume of flights and the size of aircraft required to service increasing demand are projected to grow significantly.

One negative by-product of increasing airport operations is significant noise. At present Tauranga Airport has a noise plan that only addresses noise within the immediate airport precinct itself but not in respect of aircraft arrivals into or departures from it. In the case of Tauranga Airport, the single runway being orientated east-west means that arrivals and departures are over Matua and Otumoetai starting in the early morning and into the late evening. There are no scheduled overnight operations but in the absence of any noise abatement plan such operations are not precluded. This is in contrast with some other airports in New Zealand where a curfew is in place. Airlines

are free to choose the approach and departure profiles and do not need to take noise into account.

## What needs to change?

The volume and frequency of aircraft operations will continue to grow. Tauranga Airport needs to research the impact of its projected operations. Being 100% owned and managed by the City Council it has a responsibility to address the impact on communities affected.
