Should people diagnosed with terminal illness move to superannuation to live their last days with dignity?

There is approximately \$60pw between 'Job Seeker' benefit and 'Supported Living', then \$100pw to Superannuation. That \$100 and a Gold Card would make a big difference when struggling with health and medical expenses, especially with the rising cost of living.

This is an important conversation for members before it goes to Grey Power Federation as a Remit to be presented to the government. "It's about compassion in a Welfare State where all people fare well,"

Wednesday a week ago, I had a phone call from someone saying that he was from some outfit called: "Express Couriers," (The name could be any courier company). He asked if I was going to be home because there was a package for me that required a signature.

The caller said that the delivery would arrive at my home in approximately an hour. Sure enough, about an hour later, a uniformed delivery man turned up with a beautiful basket of flowers and a bottle of wine. I was very surprised since there was no special occasion or holiday, and I, certainly, didn't expect anything like it. Intrigued, I inquired as to who the sender was. The courier replied, "I don't know, I'm only delivering the package."

Apparently, a greeting card was being sent separately. (The card has never arrived!). There was also a consignment note with the gift. He then went on to explain that because the gift contained alcohol, there was a \$3.50 "delivery/ verification charge," providing proof that he actually had delivered the package to an adult (of legal drinking age), and not just left it on the doorstep where it could be stolen or taken by anyone, especially a minor.

This sounded logical and I offered to pay him cash. He then said that the delivery company required payment to be by credit or debit card only, so that everything is properly accounted for, and this would help in keeping a legal record of the transaction.

He added, "Couriers don't carry cash to avoid loss or being, likely, targets for robbery." My husband, who by this time was standing beside me, pulled out his credit card, and the "delivery man," asked him to swipe the card on a small mobile card machine with a small screen and keypad. Frank, my husband, was asked to enter his PIN number and a receipt was printed out. He was given a copy of the transaction.

The guy said everything was in order and wished us a good day, and left.

To our horrible surprise, between Thursday and the following Monday, \$4,000 had been charged/ withdrawn from our credit/debit account at various

ATM machines.

Apparently, the "mobile credit card machine", which the deliveryman carried, now had all the info necessary to create a "dummy" card with all our card details including the PIN number.

Upon finding out about the illegal transactions on our card, we immediately notified the bank which issued us a new card, and our credit/debit account was closed. We, also, personally, went to the police, where it was confirmed that it is, definitely, a scam because several households had been similarly hit.

WARNING: Be wary of accepting any "surprise gift or package," that you neither expected nor personally ordered, especially if it involves any kind of payment as a condition of receiving the gift or package. Also, never accept anything if you do not, personally, know or there is no proper identification of who the sender is.

Above all, the only time you should give out any personal credit/debit card information is when you yourself initiated the purchase or transaction!

PLEASE, pass this on, it may just prevent someone else from being swindled.

Grey Power is an Advocacy Service and lobbyist to both Government and local Councils on any issues of interest to the 50+ age group.

In all matters, we do our best. We are after all volunteers; Grey Power does not have funded staff to be full time trouble shooters. For many gueries and in a number of circumstances often the Citizens Advice Bureau can help.

We are unable to advise or provide help around the house or other professional services. Instead, we recommend that you talk to family and friends for a recommendation, or use a local person in your local area. Usually you get a better service long term when you have good reecommendations from those who have used that service.



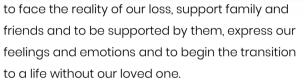
The Importance of a Meaningful **Funeral**

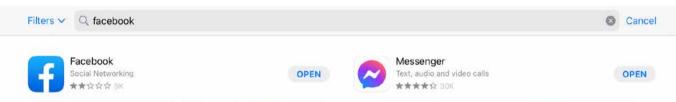

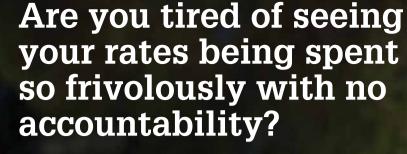

Grey Power policies Superannuation

Grey Power believes New Zealand superannuation to be a state, tax-funded scheme payable at the age of 65 years that allows the retired person an adequate income to live in reasonable comfort and dignity and be able to participate fully in the community. That superannuation be accepted as an entitlement and not means-tested. This income should

include a special provision to provide for the needs of the person living alone. A multi-party Superannuation Accord should secure the scheme.

Health

Grey Power believes in a Public Health System that protects and promotes the health of New Zealanders. Grey Power will strive to have a Parliamentary Accord on Health that interprets the declared will of the majority of citizens of New Zealand and not a system that reflects the aspirations of any current government.

Social services

Love Food - Hate Waste

Love Food, Hate Waste New Zealand is a national campaign, started in 2016, to help New Zealanders reduce their food waste. Food waste is a massive problem in New Zealand. Not only is wasting food costing us money, it is also bad for the environment. In fact, Kiwi households throw out 86kgs of edible food each year.

How do we know how much Kiwis throw away?

We went through your rubbish. We gathered bags that were left out on the street for rubbish collection, opened them and separated out the food. We then measured it to get a picture of what Kiwis throw out. It was a gross but important thing to do. Only by realising what a problem food waste is, can we begin to solve it.

Food is wasted at all stages of the supply chain, from what is produced on farms and in factories to the excess that supermarkets throw out. However, the largest proportion of food wasted in New Zealand comes from households. New Zealand homes throw away 157,398 tonnes of food per year, all of which could have been eaten. This is enough food to feed the whole of Dunedin for just under three years!

Wasting this food costs the average household \$644



of course as well.

a year. Food waste ends up in the tip, along with the rest of our rubbish. When food decomposes without oxygen in the landfill it releases methane which is a harmful greenhouse gas. New Zealand's yearly food waste produces 409.234 tonnes of carbon emissions. To offset this we would need to take 150.453 cars off the road for one year or plant 163.693 trees. When we waste food, we are also wasting all of the resources that went into making it

There are two main reasons why we throw away food: we don't eat our leftovers and some food goes bad because it is not stored properly. The foods we waste the most are bread, leftovers, citrus, apples, chicken and bananas. The Good News is that 86% of Kiwis believe wasting food is wrong. It is easy to make small but effective changes to reduce the amount of food that you waste. You can learn how to make these changes by going to the website https://lovefoodhatewaste.co.nz/
